6. The 72nd BTJA Annual Awards Lunch

7. The BTJA Mike Dickson Golf Day

This year's event will take place on **Tuesday September 29** at Silvermere in Cobham. More details will follow.



8. The BTJA Mike Dickson Award

The deadline closed at midnight on Sunday May 10. It was open to any UK resident aged between 18-24 on that date.



A panel of BTJA committee members are currently making their decision. All applicants will be informed by this Friday (June 5).



The winner will have the chance to gain invaluable experience as a member of the media at Wimbledon and The Queen's Club this summer.



To honour Mike's memory and give a helping hand to those who wish to develop a career in journalism, the BTJA created this annual award with the support of the All England Club and the LTA.



The winner will receive media accreditation for one day at The Championships at Wimbledon and one day of the HSBC Championship ATP event at Queen's with the remit of writing a bylined article on each day for the Wimbledon and LTA websites.



He/she will be given a tour of the media facilities at Wimbledon and the Queen's Club before taking a seat for matches and press conferences.



Applicants submitted a 600-word feature on any tennis-related subject of their choosing and no more than 250 words explaining why they entered, including details of present employment or studies and any previous media experience.



Mike, the long-time Daily Mail tennis correspondent and a former BTJA Chairman, passed away during the 2024 Australian Open. Many of the tributes paid to one of the most respected sports journalists in this country noted his mentorship and generosity towards younger people emerging in the industry.



9. The 2026 Spring Bulletin Award – Henry Patten - world No.1 LIVE

The unofficial April-May bulletin award goes again to doubles specialist Henry Patten. He won the Madrid 1000 Masters with long-term partner Finland's Harri Heliövaara and is currently celebrating as the new live world No.1. He and Heliövaara are also into the French Open quarter-finals.

Patten also won the award for February-March.

The left-handed 29 year old, 6 foot 6 inch, from Colchester, has now won four ATP titles this year all with Heliovaara. They were victorious in Adelaide and then back to back 500 events in Doha and Dubai, lost the Miami final before winning in Madrid on the same day that Patten's football team Ipswich was promoted back into the Premier League.



This follows their blistering finish to the 2025 season when they captured the ATP Finals in Turin along with the Paris Masters and China Open.

Together they won last year's 2025 Australian Open, and Wimbledon in 2024.



Patten has now won 12 career doubles titles and also 13 ATP Challenger titles – 11 with Julian Cash. Ten of those Challenger titles came in 2022 – a record for the most Challenger titles won in a season.



He played collegiate tennis for the University of North Carolina and became the No.1 ranked NCAA doubles player. He continued his postgraduate studies at Durham University.

During two of his university summer breaks he worked for IBM as a courtside statistician at Wimbledon. He is also a chess enthusiast.



And still look out for 6 foot 3 inches **Toby Samuel**, from Winchester in Hampshire. He'll be 24 in September.

His ranking is 149 - an improvement of 1203 places in just 12 months.

He qualified for the French Open - winning three matches - to play in his first ever main draw event.

He's won six titles since last November. This year he won back to back Challengers in Greece and an ITF event in Portugal - a run of 15 matches without defeat. In November he had a run of 18 matches without losing. This included back to back Challengers in Egypt and Bahrain and also an ITF event again in Egypt.

He also won two ITF events in September. Overall he's won 12 of 15 finals.

Samuel is a product of the University of Carolina.

Henry Patten is the world No**1=** with partner Harri Heliövaara. They've also reached the quarter-finals at the French Open. Neal Skupski, having won the Australian Open, with American Christian Harrison, is at **3** among **four** British players in the **top 10** of the world rankings.

Lloyd Glasspool is at **4=** alongside partner Julian Cash. Joe Salisbury is **14**. Then there is Luke Johnson **57** and Marcus Willis **67**, making it **seven** Brits in the top 100. Joshua Paris is at **106**, David Stevenson **113** and Ben Jones **165**.



There are **two** British women in their top 100. Olivia Nicholls is at **29=**, and Maia Lumsden is **70**.

Emily Appleton is at **106**, Harriet Dart **110**, Madeleine Brooks **117**, Amelia Rajeci **148**, Alicia Barnett **166**, and Emily Webley-Smith **168**.
