1. The BTJA Mike Dickson Golf Day

There will be an online ballot for Player of the Year and Services to British Tennis awards.



4. The Bulletin Award – Joe Salisbury and Neal Skupski

The unofficial August/September bulletin award goes to former world No.1s Joe Salisbury and Neal Skupski.

They reached their second Grand Slam final of the year - the U.S. Open following the French Open final. Both times they lost 7-5 in the third set to the Spaniard Marcel Granollers and the Argentine Horacio Zeballos.



Salisbury and Skupski have reached three other finals this year including Qatar, Barcelona and the Canadian Open in Toronto where they had four match points before losing 13-11 in a final set tie-break to British rivals Julian Cash and Lloyd Glasspool.



Salisbury, 33. has won the U.S. Open men's doubles, among his six Grand Slam titles, on three occasions with the American Rajeev Ram in successive years 2021, 2022 and 2023. That follows winning the Australian Open in 2020 again with Ram.

He also won the mixed finals at the 2021 French and U.S. Opens both with Desirae Krawczyk.

He has also reached three other Grand Slam finals apart from this year's French and U.S. Opens (total five) - the 2021 Australian Open men's doubles final with Ram, this year's Wimbledon mixed with the Brazilian Luisa Stefani and also the 2021 Wimbledon mixed with Harriet Dart.



Salisbury has won 17 ATP Tour doubles titles from 32 finals plus two ATP Tour End of Year crowns with Ram in 2022 and 2023. He also played college tennis at the University of Memphis between 2010-2014. Salisbury completed his college career winning 97 doubles matches with David O'Hare - the most in school history along with 25 singles victories in his final year which was a record at the time.



Skupski, 35, has won three Grand Slams - the 2023 men's doubles crown with Dutchman Wesley Koolhof and the 2021 and 2022 Wimbledon mixed both with American Desirae Krawczyk.

Skupski has reached three other Grand Slam finals apart from this year's French and U.S. Opens (total five) - with Koolhof at the 2022 U.S. Open and with Krawczyk in the mixed at the 2024 Australian and French Opens.

He's also won 17 ATP Tour doubles titles in 43 finals. That's along with 23 Challenger crowns from 36 finals and seven ITF victories in nine finals. Skupski went to Louisiana State University.



5. Kyle Edmund

Former British No.1 Kyle Edmund, 30, (08/01/95) retired on August 18 because of persistent injuries.

He reached a world ranking of 14, was a 2018 Australian Open semi-finalist, and won two ATP singles titles - Antwerp in 2018 and the 2020 crown at the New York Open.

He also beat Novak Djokovic in Madrid in 2018 - the one time he beat the Serbian in six attempts.

Edmund won three Challenger titles and was part of the winning 2015 Davis Cup team. He also went to the 2016 Summer Olympics in Brazil and as a junior captured the Junior Davis Cup in 2011 and also won two junior Grand Slam doubles titles.



6. Top 100 LIVE@October 1

Britain has 18 players in the top 100.

That's down one since the end of July with Harriet Dart (doubles) dropping to 132. Top 100 include - singles (7) (3 men, 4 women) and doubles (11) (8 men, 3 women).

Then there is Luke Johnson 31, Jamie Murray 48 and Marcus Willis 83 making it eight Brits in the top 100.

Pushing them is Joshua Paris 104 and David Stevenson 110.



There are also three British women in their top 100. Olivia Nicholls (WR30), Maia Lumsden (WR77), and Emily Appleton (WR80).

Madeleine Brooks is at 118, Alicia Barnett 126, Harriet Dart 132 and Jodie Burrage 145.
