1. Reg Brace and John Beddington

Reg Brace, Life President of the BTJA, until this summer, has sadly died aged 95 in early October.

Alison Targett, his daughter writes:- "He was still talking spiritedly about tennis and his love of the game. Dad was tennis correspondent for the Yorkshire Post from 1958 until his last visit to Wimbledon in 2018.

Over the years he contributed to many other tennis publications and ghost wrote a book with Billie Jean King.



He was a former chairman of the BTJA's forerunner the Lawn Tennis Writers' Association and latterly the BTJA's life President. He was also a former President of the Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association.

A keen tennis player he only retired from the game at the age of 86.

He also represented and captained the Lawn Tennis Writers' Association against the All England Club from the 1960s onwards.

He had many fun times with the LTWA, travelling the world and making many lifelong friends."



David Luddy writes:- "Reg resurrected our matches against the AELTC in the early 2000s. This led to a closer liason with the AELTC despite us being thrashed nearly every time. He was always jovial, optimistic and a stalwart of the formerly named LTWA."



John Beddington, a longtime member and supporter of the BTJA, died in mid-October aged 83.

Our chairman Tumaini Carayol writes:- "John enjoyed a long, successful career in tennis administration, which included a lengthy stint as Executive Vice President of Tennis Canada between 1979 and 1995, co-founding the Masters Tennis Event at the Royal Albert Hall in 1997 and helping to negotiate Barclays' lucrative sponsorship of the ATP World Tour Finals in London. He was a full member of the All England Club for 52 years.



John was also a great ally of tennis journalists and a strong supporter of the BTJA. As an associate member of the BTJA for decades (dating back to the days of the Lawn Tennis Writers' Association), John was generous with his time and resources, always aiming to help journalists and young tennis talent.

He also made many significant financial donations to the BTJA for many years. Overall, John raised nearly £2m for charitable causes within tennis and he staunchly believed that tennis could be a force for good."



Honorary member Richard Evans, who enjoyed a great friendship and working relationship with John *writes:* "John had a great relationship with both the British and Canadian press. His whole personality was based on welcoming inclusivity, and no one needed to explain to him the advantage of having the press onside if you were in the business of promoting the game.



"Not just tennis, but squash too, which was more difficult but benefited enormously from his passion for that sport. He also raised literally millions of dollars for Canadian tennis and various charities in England. Tennis was lucky to have him."

The BTJA committee is Tumaini Carayol (chair) (*The Guardian*), Eleanor Crooks (vice-chair and secretary) (*Press Association*), Chris Bowers (treasurer) (*TV/Radio*), David Luddy (bulletins) (*TV/Radio*), Simon Briggs (*The Telegraph*), Clive Brunskill (*Getty Images*), Stuart Fraser (*The Times*), Russell Fuller (*BBCTV/Radio*), Matthew Lambwell (*Daily Mail*), Neil McLeman (*Daily Mirror*) and Gigi Salmon (*Sky TV/BBC Radio*).



There are 75 members (*including the President*) of the BTJA. This includes 47 full members, 25 associate and 3 honorary vice presidents.



As reported in the October bulletin there will be a new Media Centre at Wimbledon. The target date is in time for the 2027 Championships.



4. The 2025 Bulletin Award – Julian Cash and Lloyd Glasspool

The unofficial 2025 bulletin award goes to world No.1 pair [Julian Cash](#) and [Lloyd Glasspool](#).

They are the first all-British team to clinch the end-of-year world No.1 spot. It's the second time they've clinched the Bulletin Award this year having won in June-July.

Cash and Glasspool, despite losing in the semi-finals of the ATP Championship to [Joe Salisbury](#) and [Neal Skupski](#), won 7 titles this season. That includes

[Wimbledon](#) plus reaching four other finals.

Of course [Henry Patten](#) with Finland's Harri Heliovaara, winners of the ATP year-end Championship in Turin, beating [Salisbury](#) and [Skupski](#) in the final, took them close especially as they also won three other titles - the [Australian Open](#), Beijing and the [Paris Masters](#) plus reaching the Dubai final.



Cash and Glasspool won in Brisbane, Qatar, Queen's, Eastbourne, the [Toronto Masters](#) and Vienna. They also reached the finals at the [Miami Masters](#), the [Monte Carlo Masters](#), Rosmalen and the [Paris Masters](#).

They were the first all-British team to win Wimbledon in 89 years beating Australian Rinky Hijikata and Dutchman David Pel 6-2, 7-6. In 1936 Pat Hughes and Raymond Tuckey captured the title.



The other Brits to recently win the men's doubles at Wimbledon were Henry Patten with

Finland's Harri Heliovaara last year, Neal Skupski with Dutchman Wesley Koolhof in 2023, and back in 2012 Jonathan Marray with Denmark's Fredrik Nielsen.



Cash, 29, from Brighton, has won 10 main tour titles (8 with Glasspool) in 23 finals. He's a 13 times finalist (4 with Glasspool).

In addition he's won 18 Challengers and 14 ITF crowns in 41 finals.

That includes 11 Challenger and 4 ITF titles with Patten.



Cash played college tennis in the USA at Mississippi State University before transferring to Oklahoma State University after one year.

He reached No.1 in the NCAA doubles rankings.



As for Glasspool, 32, from Birmingham, he's won 12 main tour titles (8 with Cash). He's a 14 times finalist (including 4 with Cash and 7 with Heliovaara). In addition he's won 5 Challengers (4 with Heliovaara) and 11 ITF crowns in 32 Challenger and ITF finals.



He played his college tennis at the University of Texas in Austin capturing the 2015 doubles crown with Soren Hess-Olesen.
