1. BTJA AGM

The AGM took place at the AELTC during the Championship on Tuesday July 8.



Forty attended. There are 77 members of the BTJA. This includes 45 full members, 28 associate and 4 honorary presidents/vice presidents.



The Chair Stuart Fraser acknowledged absent friends including former chairman Peter Blackman, having passed away in the previous year.

He also gave his report along with reports from the treasurer and the social secretary. Wimbledon issues were also discussed. Problems raised at the AGM will be discussed with the AELTC.



The annual awards lunch was a big success with a huge attendance of 172.

This year's date is December 4 at Wimbledon. There will be an online ballot for Player of the Year and Services to British Tennis awards.



There are regular meetings with the AELTC during the year, and we continue to have a very good relationship. There will be a new Media Centre at Wimbledon. The target date is in time for the 2027 Championships.



This year was the launch of the Mike Dickson award (see under 4).



2. BTJA Committee Meetings and the AELTC

The last committee meeting was held at Queen's during the double-header grass court events during June.

We discussed the treasurer's report, membership, the social secretary's report, a review of our Annual Awards lunch, Wimbledon matters and the upcoming election of our committee.



A warm welcome to Matthew Lambwell and Gigi Salmon who were elected at the AGM onto the BTJA committee.


The next committee meeting - there are three a year (April at the AELTC, June during Queen's and October/November) – will be in the autumn.

4. The BTJA Mike Dickson Award

This year was the launch of the Mike Dickson award, which gives a young person of 18-24 to attend Queen's and Wimbledon as part of the media. Mike left money in his will and the award was discussed with his family and launched in May. There were 36 entries of an exceptional

standard.

The winner - selected by a panel of four committee members, was Hannah Fitzpatrick, 20, from Belfast. She enjoyed the experience and will also be invited to the Awards Lunch. All travel expenses were covered by the BTJA and The Clermont Victoria kindly provided overnight accommodation.

6. The Bulletin Award – Julian Cash and Lloyd Glasspool

The unofficial June-July bulletin award goes to Julian Cash and Lloyd Glasspool.

They won this year's Wimbledon men's doubles title - the first all-British team to win the crown in 89 years beating Australian Rinky Hijikata and Dutchman David Pel 6-2, 7-6.



This follows victories at Wimbledon for Henry Patten with Finland's Harri Heliovaara last year, Neal Skupski with Dutchman Wesley Koolhof in 2023, and back in 2012 Jonathan Marray with Denmark's Fredrik Nielsen.

They are the only British winners since 1936 when Pat Hughes and Raymond Tuckey captured the title.



Cash, 28, from Brighton. world ranked 4, has won 5 titles this year including Wimbledon and reached three other finals - all with Glasspool.

In total he's won 8 titles on the main tour (6 with Glasspool) in 16 finals (9 with Glasspool). In addition he's won 32 Challenger and ITF crowns in 41 finals.

That includes 11 Challenger and 4 ITF titles with Patten.



Cash played college tennis in the USA at Mississippi State University before transferring to Oklahoma State University after one year.

He reached No.1 in the NCAA doubles rankings.



As for Glasspool, 31. from Birmingham. world ranked 3, he's won 10 main tour titles (3 with Heliovaara) in 23 finals (7 with Heliovaara). 5 Challengers (4 with Heliovaara) and 10 ITF crowns.



He played his college tennis at the University of Texas in Austin capturing the 2015 doubles crown with Soren Hess-Olesen.



7. Top 100

Britain has 19 players in the top 100 (▲2 from May 31 - Francesca Jones singles; Marcus Willis doubles):

Singles (7) (3 men, 4 women) and doubles (12) (8 men, 4 women).



8. Brits - Live Singles@July 29

Jack Draper is world ranked 5, Cameron Norrie 39 and Jacob Fearnley 56.

Dan Evans is up to 130 while Billy Harris is 145.

Emma Raducanu is at 39, Katie Boulter 42, Sony Kartal 48 and Francesca Jones 84 (inside the top 100 for the first time after winning two WTA125 tournaments back to back this month - July). She's now won 11 titles - all on clay.



9. Brits - Live Doubles@July 29

Three British players are in the top 5 - Lloyd Glasspool is world ranked 3, Julian Cash is 4 and Henry Patten is 5. In fact there are five British players in the top 15 – Glasspool, Cash, Patten along with Neal Skupski (WR14) and Joe Salisbury (WR15).

Jamie Murray (WR28) and Luke Johnson (WR30) make it 7 Brits in the top 30. Marcus Willis is back inside the top 100 at 91. David Stevenson is now at 105, and Joshua Paris is at 117. There are also four British women in their top 100. Olivia Nicholls (WR26), Maia Lumsden (WR74), Harriet Dart (WR77), and Emily Appleton (WR78). Alicia Barnett is at 110, Jodie Burrage 114, Eden Silva 128 and Madeleine Brooks at 130. 10.
